HOW A BULLDOG BAG HAPPENS

Are you curious about what goes on behind the scenes that culminates in the Bulldog Bags that eligible children in the SMCSD take home two times a month during the school year? A lot of planning goes into each packing!! The Menu/Purchasing Committee plans the Menus of items to be included in Bulldog Bags for the school year. In planning the menus, they take into account the Food Drives held by community organizations, churches, business, and the schools. The Menu/Purchasing Committee consists of 4 teams; they divide the school year, so each team is only responsible for part of the school year. The Team that is responsible for planning the actual Food Items that will go into the month's Bulldog Bags, makes their final decision based on what has been collected in the Food Drives, the availability of items at the Akron-Canton Regional Food Bank, and sale prices at local retailers.

As Bulldog Bags, Inc. has limited storage, the food is picked up by the volunteers during the week of packing and taken to Stow City Hall. If the Firemen are not out on a call, they generously volunteer to help unload the cases of food. The morning of packing, volunteers arrive at Stow City Hall at 8:15 a.m. to unbox the food and set it up in an assembly line, so that it will be ready for more volunteers who arrive by 9 a.m. The volunteers walk around the tables, filling the Bags; the Bags are then put into bins, which are moved to the hall, where the Delivery volunteers will pick them up and deliver them to the schools. Before 10 a.m., the leftover items are inventoried, stored, and the room is returned to pre-set up order. The whole process is a well-oiled machine, but there is a lot of preparation that goes into filling the Bulldog Bags! Kudos to the Bulldog Bags, Inc. Menu/Purchasing Committee and the Packing Chairperson who put in so much organization into making Packing Day look easy, when a plastic bag is turned into a Bulldog Bag!

We want students to show up Monday mornings hungry for LEARNING, not hungry for food!

PACKING VOLUNTEERS SIGN-UP

DID YOU KNOW??

As the volunteers unbox the food items during the set-up for packing, the boxes are broken down and the cardboard is taken to the Stow Recycling Center, 5080 Stow Road; money received from the recycling of the cardboard goes to the Urban Forestry Commission in Stow and they purchase trees for the City of Stow! Bulldog Bags, Inc. gives back to the community!

The plastic that is with the cases of food is taken to a Center that recycles plastic bags.



The *Urban Forestry Commission* also accepts electronic devices (iPads, Tablets, iPhones, cell phones, iPods, mp3 players) at Stow City Hall and the money generated, also, helps to purchase trees for the City of Stow.




CHIPOTLE Fundraiser: Wednesday, Nov. 20, 2019
